

Ages and Stages Questionnaires - Social and Emotional Development:

Assessments carried out with parents on their child's social and emotional development over the past year have shown the following results:

49% of children maintained their developmental progress, with scores remaining consistent between assessments.

37% completed their first ASQ assessment, providing a baseline measure of their development.

5% showed an improvement in their developmental scores between assessments.

7% showed a decrease in scores and received additional monitoring and support.

96% of children were assessed as having no developmental risk.

4% of children required ongoing monitoring of their development.

0% of children required referral to specialist services.

Overall, these results demonstrate that the vast majority of children attending The Family Haven were developing appropriately for their age, with almost all children showing no developmental concerns. The findings suggest that the support provided to parents through play-based learning, communication activities, and guidance on child development is helping children to reach expected developmental milestones and giving families the confidence to support their children's learning and development at home.
